DECISION No. 1/2003

OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE OF THE FREE TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE SLOVAK REPUBLIC AND THE REPUBLIC OF TURKEY

amending the Protocol 3 concerning the definition of the concept of "originating products" and methods of administrative cooperation

THE JOINT COMMITTEE,

Having in mind the Free Trade Agreement between the Slovak Republic and the Republic of Turkey, signed in Ankara on October 20, 1997 and Protocol 3 to this Agreement concerning the definition of the concept of "originating products" and methods of administrative cooperation as amended by Decisions of the Joint Committee No. 1/1998, No. 1/1999, No. 1/2000 and No. 2/2001,

Nothing that identical protocols on rules of origin must be applied among all pan-European partner countries.

Having in mind provisions of Articles 33, 34 and 36 of

the Free Trade Agreement between the Slovak Republic and the Republic of Turkey,

Whereas Article 38 of Protocol 3 to the Agreement provides that the Joint Committee may amend the provisions of the Protocol;

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1

Ex 4114 in Annex II to Protocol 3 concerning the definition of the concept of "originating products" and methods of administrative cooperation to the Agreement, shall be amended as follows:

HS heading No	Description of product	Working or processing carried out on non-originating materials that confers originating status	
(1)	(2)	(3) or	(4)
ex 4114	Patent leather and patent laminated leather; meta- llised leather	Manufacture from materials of headings 4104 to 4106, 4107, 4112 or 4113, provided that their total value does not exceed 50 % of the ex-works price of the product	

Article 2

This Decision shall enter into force on the first day of the second month following the day of a receipt of the latter diplomatic note confirming the approval by the Government of the respective Party. IN WITNESS WHEREOF the undersigned plenipotentiaries being duly authorized thereto, have signed this Decision.
